Original title: Speech for a Melting Statue

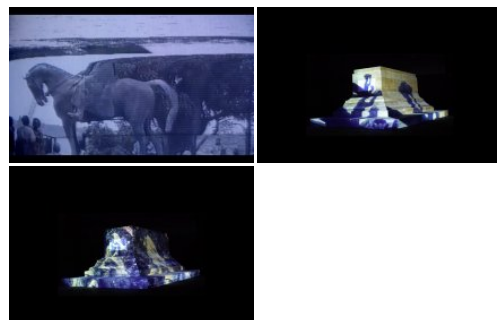
